Mandate

Objectives

- 1. **Education**. Provide information and education on topics of interest to Early Career Psychologists
- 2. Mentoring Provide Psychologists presenting on issues; available for discussion
- 3. **Networking** Provide opportunities for networking with other psychologists. (e.g., Meet & Greet events)
- 4. **Social Support** Provide opportunities to consult and discuss experiences with other Psychologists.
- 5. Advocacy Play a role in advocating for issues concerning Psychologists

Membership

Members are committed to enhancing the experience of Early Career Psychologists in Nova Scotia, and take an active part in the work of this committee.
